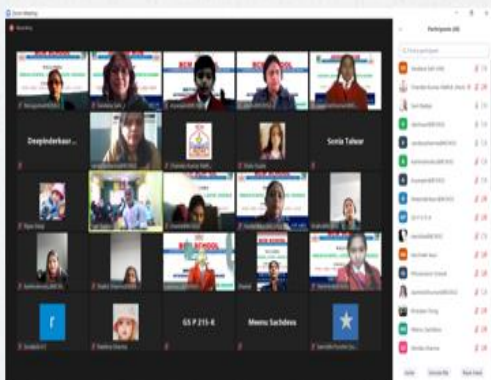

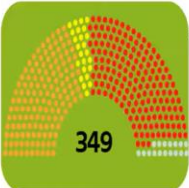
**We move together and so we grow together**

## The Parliament



The Parliament of Kenya is bicameral house consisting of the National Assembly and the Senate. The National Assembly has in total 349 members plus the Speaker who is an ex-officio. The Senate consists of 67 members plus the Speaker, who is an ex-officio member



The parliament of India consists of 2 Houses named as Lok Sabha with 545 members plus the speaker  
 • Rajya Sabha with 250 members plus the speaker.

## Political Framework



The Republic of Kenya is a unitary State divided into 47 counties. The country is run by the National Government and 47 county governments.

→ A mix of one party and multi-party system



India is a federal republic with 28 states and 8 union territories. It is run by the Union Government as well as Elected State Legislative Assembly.

## Women Representation



### KENYA

- ▶ Out of 349 members of the National Assembly, 47 are women representatives.
- ▶ In Senate, 16 women members shall be nominated by the political parties according to their proportion of members.

### INDIA

- ▶ In India, in the Parliament and State Legislative Assembly, number of seats for women are not fixed. But at the local level, 1/3 women representation is mandatory.

## Political Executives



The President of the Republic of Kenya, together with the Deputy-President and the Cabinet Secretaries comprise the executive. The President shall nominate and, with the approval of the National Assembly, appoint Cabinet Secretaries. A Cabinet Secretary shall not be a Member of Parliament.

The president, the prime minister and his Cabinet Ministers comprise the executive of the country. These are called political executives

Permanent executives comprise the Civil Servants who are appointed by the Union Public Service Commission.

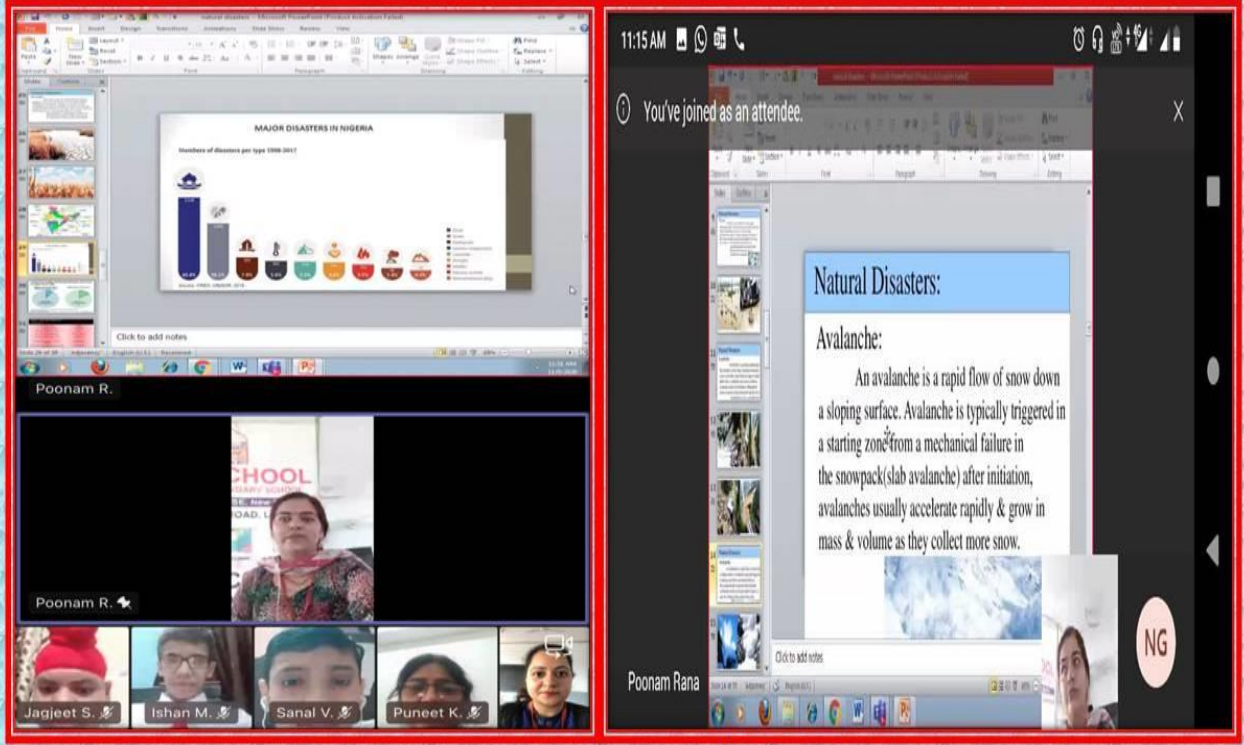

**BCMITEES PREPARED TO PROTECT NATURE AND SURVIVE**

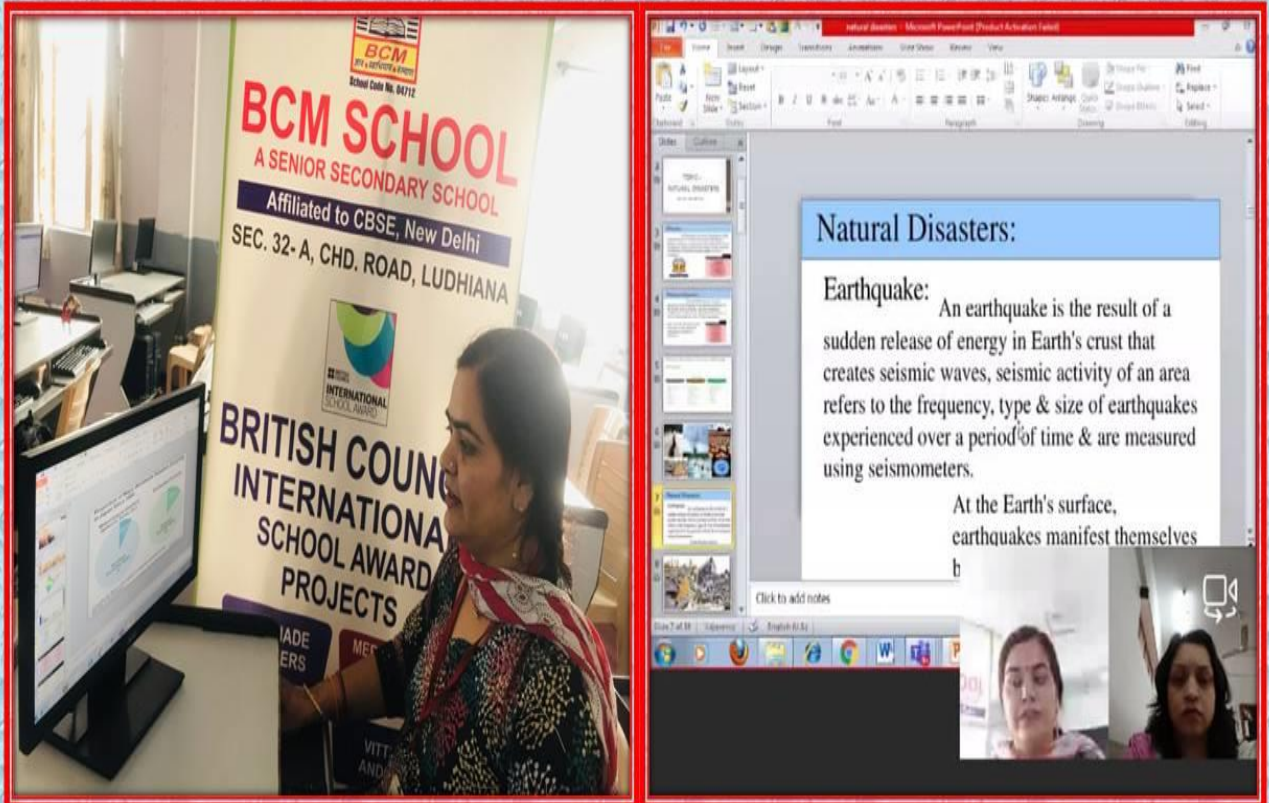
