

GENERAL SCHOOL RULES

- Every student must reach school in time before the commencement of morning assembly i.e. 7:40 (summer) /8:40am (winter). Late comers should immediately report at the reception and present a valid reason with evidence for being late; failing which they will be issued a warning note and sent back home.
- 2. Students should be smartly dressed up in school uniform.
- 3. Boy students are not allowed to sport a long hair cut. If anyone is found with long hair, their parents will be called and they will be sent back and will not be accepted in classes until they get an appropriate hair cut.
- 4. Students are not permitted to receive any visitors or make phone calls during the school hours. In case of any urgency to do so, prior permission of the Principal or the section In-charge is to be sought.
- 5. Students should observe all the rules of discipline inside and outside the class. Disciplinary action will be taken against the student who violates the discipline of the school/misbehaves/uses unfair means in exams/attends school in improper uniform/misses classes before examination
- 6. Students who are escorted to and from school in the care of servants or other domestic staff may not leave the school premises without their nominated escort. In case of delay in the arrival of such escorts, they should report the matter to the school office. Students who go home at their own should not loiter about on the way.
- 7. The school reserves the right to terminate the continuance of the students with unsatisfactory progress in studies or whose conduct is a bad example for others.
- 8. Bullying and use of foul language are punishable offences. Anyone found doing the same is liable to be issued Yellow/Red card which subsequently will result in expulsion from school.
- Students are strictly forbidden to bring objectionable literature/pictures/ I-Pods/CDs/Pen-drives etc to school.
- 10. Damaging or disfiguring school property is a serious offence. Any such damage will have to be made good by the defaulter only. Damage done by accident should be reported to the class incharge immediately.
- 11. In the interest of their own safety, students are advised not to buy or receive any gifts/food stuffs from anyone at all en route.
- 12. Students are forbidden to buy any eatables from hawkers outside the school.
- 13. The school is committed to protecting the environment and expects its students to be environment friendly in all their actions.
- 14. Students are not allowed to celebrate their birthday at school.
- 15. Students are not allowed to wear any jewellery or bring any valuables to school. School is not responsible for the loss of any such belongings. However, students from class V onwards are allowed to wear simple watch with black strap. Smart watches not allowed.

- 16. No student has the permission to commute to school on his/her self-driven geared two wheeler without a driving license. Students have to procure tokens for parking their vehicles in the school parking area. Defaulters shall be barred from parking the vehicle inside school campus.
- 17. Applying henna/nail polish /getting tattoos incarved/bleaching/ colouring hair is strictly prohibited. Nails must be kept short and clean at all times.
- 18. Students can't leave school campus on any pretext during school hours except in emergency with prior permission of the Principal.
- 19. It is mandatory for all students, unless instructed otherwise, to be present for festivals and functions celebrated in the school campus.
- 20. Strict adherence to prescribed uniform, cleanliness and personal hygiene is to be ensured.
- 21. No physical violence is permitted in the school premises. Creating indiscipline, using unfair means in examination or deviation from any school rules will result in the issue of Yellow/Red card.
- 22. Bringing mobile phones to school is strictly forbidden. Mobile Phone once confiscated shall remain in school's possession and will result in the issue of yellow card.

Repeated deviation from any school rules may result in expulsion from the school.

SCHOOL UNIFORM RULES

Wearing of the school uniform is a sacred ritual as it brings about uniformity at BCM School, the unique feeling of 'oneness', thus underlying the sense of pride in the school dress.

- * Students must always wear clean and complete uniform and as specified summer, winter or House uniform. Uniform defaulters shall be fined and sent back home.
- * I-Card is an integral part of school uniform and must be worn every day.
- * No student is allowed to come to school/attend any function/PTM in any other dress than school uniform.
- * Students must wear school uniform outside the campus while representing the school.
- * Girls with long hair are required to plait their hair in two braids and wear ribbons.
- * Non-Sikh boys should get their hair cut at regular intervals and ensure that it remains combed and tidy.

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

- * No student who has been absent on the previous day will be allowed to attend class unless his/her parents have entered an explanation stating the reasons for the absence in the Almanac. Students absenting themselves without prior intimation will be penalized as per CBSE Examination bye laws.
- * In case of absence of more than two days on medical grounds, medical certificate and prescription should be attached along with the application.
- * There is no provision for half day leave except in extreme exigencies. So students who are not well should not be sent to school even on exam/test days. Child shall be marked absent if he/she were to be taken home by parents during school hours even if it were to be an assessment day.
- * A student who absents himself/herself for consecutive ten days from the school without a leave sanctioned by the Principal, is liable to get his/her name struck off the rolls of the school. Re-admission may only be entirely on the discretion of the Principal and only after payment of a re-admission fee.
- * All students are expected to attend school on the opening day after the vacation.

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR DEALING WITH STUDENTS HAVING ATTENDANCE LESS THAN THE PRESCRIBED PERCENTAGE OF ATTENDANCE.

- * All the students must realize importance of attending the classes regularly and ensure minimum 75% attendance as specified by the Central Board of Secondary Education for a student to be eligible to appear for the Class X and XII examinations. Attendance will be calculated as on 1st January of the Academic session.
- * Students and parents must submit medical certificate(s) from the competent authority/leave application supporting the reason for availing/taking leave as and when leave is availed.
- * In case of shortage of attendance, as per Rule 13 and Rule 14 of the Examination Bye Laws of CBSE, the parents can request for the percentage of attendance to be considered for condonation on the following grounds and on submission of desired documents and certificates of the Competent Authority latest by 1 Jan. 2024.

REWARDS AND REPRIMANDS

To motivate students to sustain their good actions, exemplary behaviour and self-discipline, rewards are conferred upon students whereas reprimands are there for those who indulge in undesirable actions and also to deter others from doing the same.

MERIT CARD

Merits cards are awarded to students for 100% Attendance and other traits like Obedience, Discipline, Punctuality, Regularity in H.W. completion, Good Handwriting and Good Communication skills.

YELLOW CARD

For irregularity, being in improper uniform, omission of H.W., bunking periods, bringing mobile phone, disobedience to teachers etc., a student is liable to be issued Yellow Card and get imposed a fine of Rs. 500/-. The receipt of two yellow cards within one academic session shall lead to the issuance of Red Card.

RED CARD

A student using foul language, showing malicious behaviour, damaging school property, using unfair means in examination/tests and stealing is liable to receive Red Card along with suspension from school for one week and a fine of Rs. 800/-. Any student on two Red Cards is not liable for promotion to the next class. It may also lead to the expulsion of the offender from the school.

LIBRARY

The total books in the school libraries is a mind boggling number of around 40,000 titles covering diverse and wide variety of subjects. The libraries subscribe to over 60 periodicals and 13 leading Dailies, along with general reading and long and short range reference services.

LIBRARY RULES:

- * Strict discipline and decorum have to be maintained in the library.
- * Each class has one library period per week.
- * Books are issued to each student for a period of one week. The books may be re-issued on request if there is no demand by others.
- * Reference books are not for issuance. They can be read sitting only in the library.
- * Books issued should be returned on time, failing which, borrowing facility will be withdrawn for a fixed period.
- * Books marked, disfigured, damaged or lost while in students' possession will have to be replaced by the borrower failing which the current cost of the book will have to be paid.
- * Unless the previously issued book is returned, students will not be eligible for a fresh issue.
- * Issuance of books shall be stopped 15 days before examination for annual stock checking.
- * It is mandatory for all the students to do the activities stated in the list of Library Activities.
- * No personal belongings are allowed inside the Library.



HOME WORK POLICY

Home Work is a constructive tool in the teaching learning process for the reinforcement of matter learnt in school. It is an opportunity to:

- * Consolidate Learning
- * Help students develop independent study habits.
- * Enable the teachers to identify the students who need further attention, explanation and practice.

FOR STUDENTS' CONSIDERATION

- * Develop the habit of doing P.W. regularly, keeping your parents informed about it and showing the Home Assignments to them.
- * Follow a time table as per the needs of each subject.
- * Do your P.W. at your own. In case of any problem, discuss it with your teachers the next day.
- * Do it sitting in a quiet uninterrupted atmosphere.
- * Take a short break after the completion of one task.
- * Reflect regularly on your time use. Set priorities for your work.

ADMISSION

Admission will be confined to classes only where there is a vacant seat. Parents who want to get their children admitted in the school should get their names registered in the school office. Registration only makes the child eligible for interview and admission test. It does not guarantee admission.

RULES OF ADMISSION

- 1. Before seeking admission for his/her ward in the school, Parent/Guardian is expected to go through the various rules given on the school website.
- 2. Admission will be made strictly on merit and is subject to written test.
- Non BCM Students are required to appear in a pre-admission test and pupils will be placed in the standard most suited to their attainments as assessed by the Principal.
- 4. Parents/Guardians must attach attested Birth Certificate of their ward in order to get admission in Nursery and produce Original Birth Certificate at the time of interview. For admission to Primary and Higher classes, it is compulsory for the students to submit a Transfer Certificate or School Leaving Certificate along with mark sheet/progress report card from the school last attended. If the above mentioned documents are not produced, the candidate will not get admission in the school.
- 5. Candidates who come from other Boards of Education than C.B.S.E. must have their School Leaving Certificate/Transfer Certificate duly countersigned by the Board Authorities from which they migrate.

WITHDRAWALS

- Application for School Leaving Certificate should be given a month earlier by the
 parents or guardians of a student seeking withdrawal. Any such application
 should be accompanied by clearance certificate regarding payment of the school
 dues of the student.
- 2. School fee and other charges are charged upto the month of issuance of School Leaving Certificate.
- 3. A pupil, who has left the school, will normally not be readmitted.
- 4. The Principal reserves the right to compel the parents to withdraw their child on any of the following grounds:
 - (a) Irregular attendance
 - (b) Unsatisfactory academic progress
 - (c) Bad Conduct
 - (d) Moral Breach or Grave insubordination
 - (e) Non-payment of School Fee till last working day of month.

PAYMENT OF SCHOOL FEE

- 1. Fee is payable quarterly / monthly. However, it can be deposited for the full year.
- 2. Fee should be preferably deposited online. (www.bcmschools.org)
- 3. For payment by cheques, write all personal details like student's name, adm. No., class and section on the backside of the cheque. The cheque should be in favour of BCM Sr. Sec. School and should be deposited at the school office.
- 4. For payment by Swipe, visit the school office. Please note, International or business cards are not acceptable for Swipe.
- 5. Monthly online fee must be deposited before 10th of the month after that fine of Rs. 10/per week will be imposed.
- Quarterly online fee must be deposited before 20th of the month after that fine of Rs. 10/ per week will be imposed.

EXAMINATION POLICY & ASSESSMENT METHODOLOGY

I-V

- 1. The school lays stress on the holistic development of the child.
- 2. School follows the latest Evaluation Pattern issued by CBSE.
- Focus is on developing their listening, speaking, reading and writing skills.
 The school follows 'No Bags', 'No Home Work' during the formative years of child's schooling.

Classes VI-X

For classes VI - X, the examination from academic session 2024-25 and onwards would be conducted as per the remodelled assessment scheme explained in NEP 2020.

Classes XI & XII

There will be two Periodic tests, one Terminal Examination and an Annual Examination for class XI.

For **Classes X & XII**, two Periodic tests, one Terminal Examination and Preboard examination are followed by the final Board Examination conducted by CBSE.



EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION RULES

- * At least 75% attendance is compulsory for promotion to the next class. This stipulation can be relaxed on genuine grounds on the discretion of the Principal.
- * There is no provision for reassessing students who remain absent on the day of examination.
- * A student not appearing in exams on medical grounds shall be given weightage only.
- * Answer sheets of both the terms are shown to students/Parents.
- * A student of XI failing in two-subjects will be considered fail.
- * A student failing in one subject may be given one chance of retest.
- * Students found using any unfair means during any of the assessments will be given Zero in that subject. A repetition of such action in future will result in the prompt issuance of a Transfer Certificate, without notice.



To inculcate a spirit of healthy competition and sense of belongingness, the entire school community has been divided into four Houses-Beas, Ravi, Sutlej and Yamuna. Specific colour has been allotted to each house to mark its identity. Various inter house competitions are held on a regular basis to promote all round development of the BCMites. Each house presents its House Show each year giving children of all ages an equal opportunity to

perform on the stage and learn the art of stage management and production. On Wednesdays, students have to wear house uniform. Approved house colours are:

STUDENT COUNCIL

PARENT TEACHER CONTACT

Parents will be allotted specific timings to meet teachers of their child on PTM days and they must be punctual as per the given schedule to avoid any disappointment and embarrassment.
- * Please note that it is mandatory for parents to attend the PTM as it contributes valuably in all round development of the child. Children must accompany their parents dressed in school uniform carrying almanac.
- * Parents shall be kept informed through school almanac about the progress of their ward or any matter regarding his/her conduct. Parents should countersign any entry made by the teacher and take serious view of the same.
- * Parents are kept informed and in contact through SMS Notification and supplement notices.
- * School website & School ERP System is another channel to keep parents abreast with latest updates, school activities, assignments, projects etc.

FOR PARENTS' CONSIDERATION

- 1. Fee should be preferably deposited online.
- 2. Parents / Guardian are requested to visit the school premises in decent attires.
- 3. Make sure that your child has his/her breakfast daily .Don't send junk food. Send fruits for Fruit Break and lunch in tiffin in the morning along with your child. Tiffin shall not be sent in the class room later.
- 4. Check your ward's diary every day for any entries/circulars and acknowledge their receipt. Ensure proper action according to the remarks given by the teachers.
- Assist your ward in making a practical time table and developing regular study habits. Help them improve their handwriting and maintain their bags properly.
- 6. Criticism of teacher should be meticulously avoided in presence of your ward. If you have any equitable complaint, it should be brought into the Principal's notice.
- 7. Please motivate your child to communicate in English at home.
- 8. Any behavioural irregularity of the child should be brought into the knowledge of teachers.
- 9. Please make sure that your child is regular and punctual in school. Half day leaves are not granted except in extreme exigencies. Students late for school will be sent back home.
- 10. Please inculcate good moral and social values in your child.
- 11. Please don't attempt to walk into the class or meet the teacher when the class is in progress.
- 12. Please attend all PTMs as it ensures smooth progress of your child at school.
- 13. Please park your vehicles in an orderly manner to avoid any inconvenience to students and passers-by.
- 14. Please provide support to your child to participate in sports & extracurricular activities and be present on school functions to motivate him/her.

INNOVATION AND TINKERING LAB

The Prestigious innovation and tinkering lab of BCM School is established with a vision to foster curiosity, creativity, and imagination in young minds. It inculcates skills such as design mind-set, computational thinking, adaptive learning, physical computing etc. ITL is a workspace where young minds can learn innovation skills, sculpt ideas through hands-on activities, work and learn in a flexible environment. Young children get a chance to work with tools and equipment to understand the concepts of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math). 

Chandrayaan-3



India's lunar mission Chandrayaan 3 was launched on July 14, 2023 at 2:35 P.M. by Launch Vehicle Mark-III (LVM-3) from SatishDhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota by the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO). The spacecraft landed at the moon's South Pole, a location where the presence of water molecules was discovered during India's inaugural moon mission in 2008. Now, India has become the fourth country to accomplish a gentle touchdown on the Moon, following the US, USSR, China, and Israel.

Chandrayaan-3 consists of Lander Module (LM), Propulsion Module (PM) and a Rover with an objective of developing and demonstrating new technologies required for Interplanetary Missions. The Lander and the Rover have scientific payloads to carryout experiments on the lunar surface. The rover is outfitted with two scientific instruments known as payloads: the Alpha Particle X-ray Spectrometer (APXS) and the Laser Induced Breakdown Spectroscope (LIBS). The APXS will play a crucial role in analysing the composition of the lunar soil and rocks near the landing site, focusing on elements such as magnesium, aluminium, silicon, potassium, calcium, titanium, and iron. Its findings will provide valuable insights into the elemental makeup of the lunar surface.

India has built **the world's first portable disaster hospital** that can be airlifted and ported to provide essential medical supplies to any developing country affected by natural disaster or humanitarian crisis. This can handle several severe injuries including 40 bullet injuries, 25 major bleeds, 25 major burns, around 10 head injuries, long limb fractures, spinal injuries, chest injuries, or spinal fracture. It offers operation theatre, mini-ICU, ventilator, blood test equipment, X-ray machine, cooking station, food, water, shelter, power generator and much more.

Known as 'AarogyaMaitri Cube', India has built this product under project BHISHM — Bharat Health Initiative for SahyogHita and Maitri. The design allows joining two cages — master cube one and master cube two, including three frames, each accommodating 12 mini-cubes 72 cubes in total — with damage control capabilities for 200 survivors for a period of 48 hours.India has already donated two AarogyaMaitri Cubes to Myanmar as a goodwill gesture; one is being readied for donation to Sri Lanka.

Srinivasa Ramanujam

(The Amazing saga of A Great Mathematician)



Born On : 22 December, 1887 Died On : 26 April, 1920

Srinivasa Ramanujan was a mathematician par excellence. He is believed to be the greatest mathematician of the 20th century. He made significant contribution to the analytical theory of numbers and worked on elliptic functions, continued fractions and infinite series. He became a fellow of Royal Society on 28 February, 1918 and a fellow of Trinity College, Cambridge. Ramanujam still lives in the hearts of the people. Various memorials (portrait, Ramanujam Chair, Ramanujam institute) have been made in his honour. On his 75th birthday, a postal stamp was issued in his honour. His birth centenary was celebrated in 1987 in U.K. and U.S.A. in the form of lectures, seminars and research work.

Achievements

First Indian scholar who received NobelPrize for Physics in 1930.

At the age of 11 he passed his matriculation. In 1904, he passed his B.A. from the Presidency college, Madras. In 1907 he passed his M.A. obtaining the highest distinctions. In 1921, he was awarded the prestigious degree of 'Doctor of Science' and in 1924 he was elected a fellow of the Royal society of London. In 1928, he was elected as President of the Indian Science Congress and in 1929, the title of 'Sir' was conferred by British government. In 1930, Sir C.V. Raman was awarded Nobel Prize in Physics. Later on the discovery was christened as "Raman Effect". From 1933 to 1948, he was the Director of Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore.



Einstein, one of the renowned scientists, formulated theory of Relativity showing equivalence of energy and mass i.e., $E = mc^2$ which was later used in the invention of Atomic Bomb.

In 1911, he was appointed professor in Prague and was given membership of the Royal Prussian Academy of Science and directorship of the new Kaiser Wilhelm Institute in Bertin. In 1922, he was appointed to the League of Nations Commission for Intellectual Co-operaton. In 1933 he joined job at the New Institute of Princeton, New Jersey.

Achievements

Founded Tata Institute of Fundamental Research, was the first chairman of India's Atomic energy Commission, was chairman of the first United Nations conference on the Peaceful Uses of Atomic energy held in Geneva in 1955.

After graduating from Elphinstone college and the Royal Institute of Science in Bombay, he went to Cambridge University. In 1934, he received his doctorate. With the help of JRD Tata, he established the Tata Institute of Fundamental Research in Mumbai. In 1945, he became the Director of Tata Institute of Fundamental Research Dr. Homi Bhabha as a scientist of very high calibre, received many national and international awards and honours. The government of India honoured him with Padma Bhushan in 1954.
