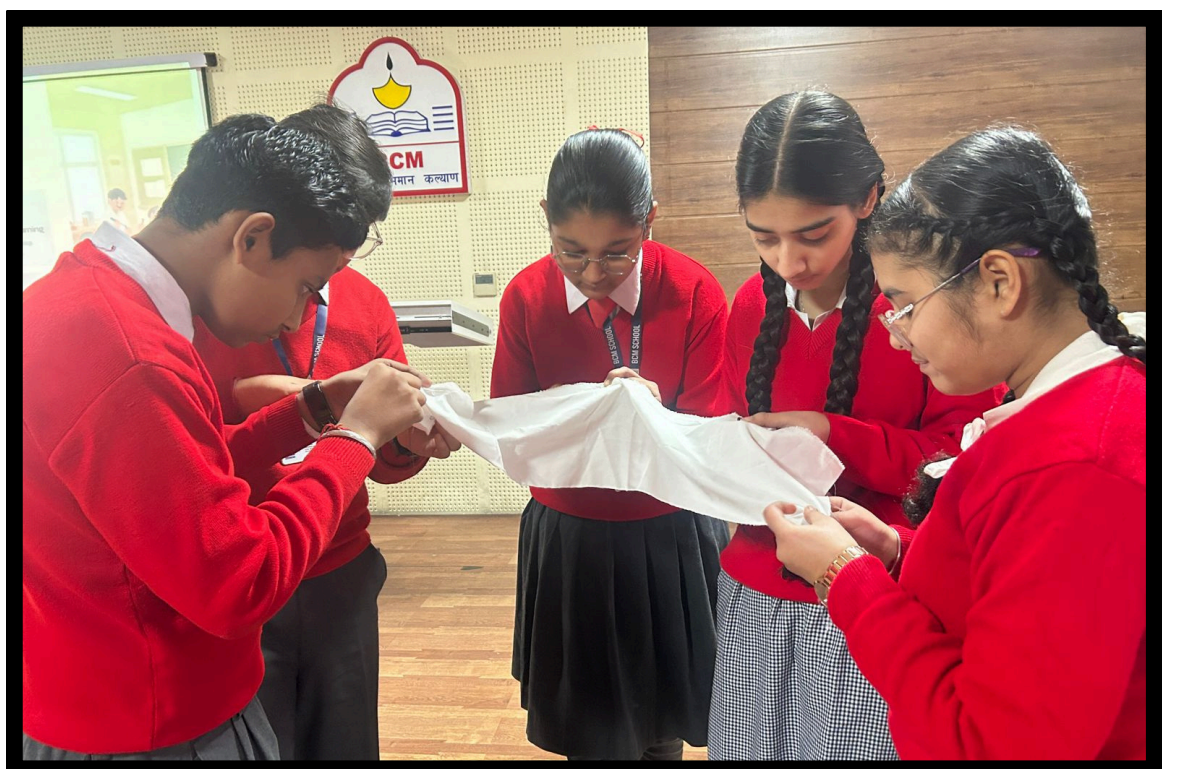
FUTURE LEADERS' SELF-SKILLS ENRICHMENT PROGRAM
