IIMUN UK STUDY PROGRAMME: A GLOBAL MUN EXPERIENCE

A group of IIMUN delegates, including Jiya (XII Commerce), Krishna Bajaj (XII Commerce), Tushar Kapoor (XII Commerce) and Purav Arora (XI), accompanied by faculty member Ms. Gurpreet Kaur from BCM School, Chandigarh Road, Ludhiana, participated in a UK Study Programme organised under the IIMUN framework.

The programme began on January 26 with a Republic Day programme at the Indian High Commission in London, where the delegates interacted with High Commissioner Mr. Vikram Doraiswami and gained an understanding of India's diplomatic functioning abroad. As part of the academic and MUN exposure, the group visited King's College London, the University of Westminster and the London School of Economics, where they were briefed about academic structures, global programmes and student engagement.

The delegates later visited Oxford University, Imperial College London and Cambridge University. Sessions and guided interactions were conducted at Lady Margaret Hall, St John's College and Downing College, providing insight into the academic environment and institutional heritage of these universities.

The programme also included an interaction with Mr. Bob Blackman MP and Lord Karan Billimoria at the British Parliament. A discussion session was held at the Indian Gymkhana on the topic of India-UK relations, aligning with the objectives of diplomatic dialogue and international understanding associated with MUN participation. Cultural exposure was provided through visits to Buckingham Palace, the Tower of London and a cruise on the River Thames. The programme concluded with a certificate distribution ceremony followed by a social interaction session, marking the completion of the UK Study Programme.









