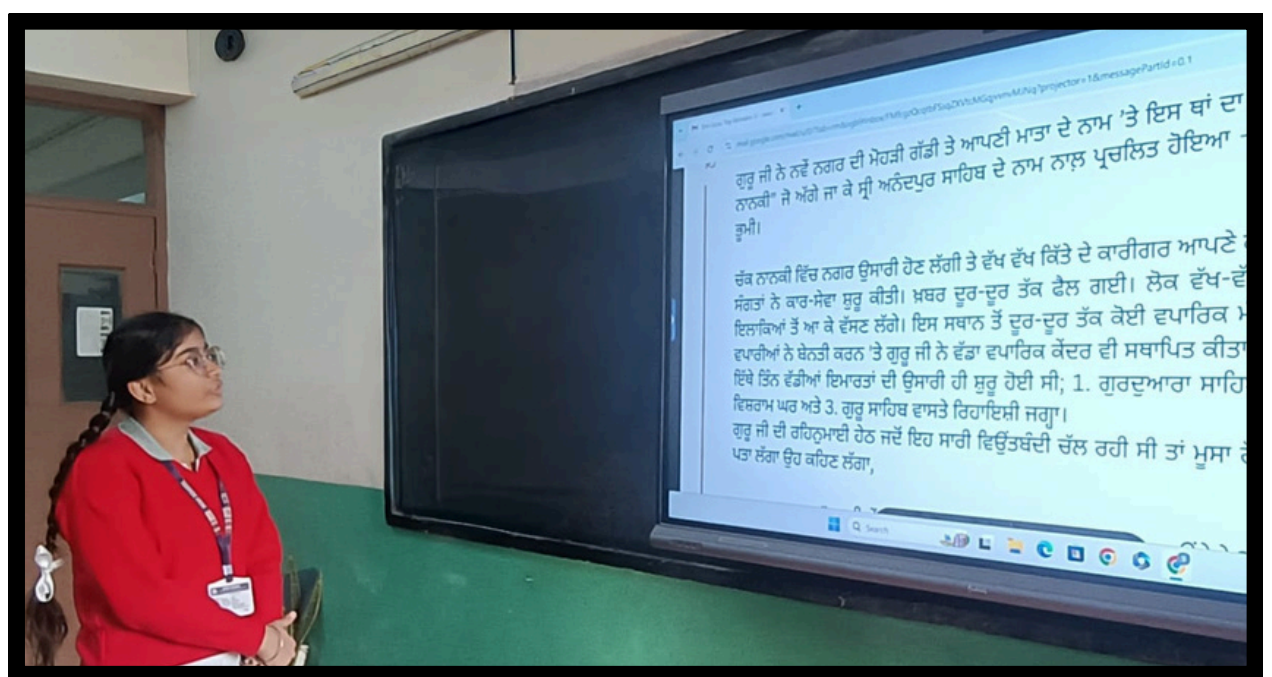
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## REMEMBERING THE GREAT SACRIFICE: GURU TEG BAHADUR JI'S 350TH MARTYRDOM DAY
